

The syllabus has been chosen by a group of local musicians and includes classes for a wide variety of skills.

Your loyal support for this event is much appreciated. We greatly value the continued commitment of all our contributors.

Members of the public are most welcome to attend all events during the Festival for both daytime and evening sessions. Admission to all events except the Festival Concert is free.

The Festival Concert will be held in the Cinema in Newton Stewart on Saturday 15 March at 2pm. Tickets are £5. Children and performers are free.

The Festival Timetable and full Programme will be available online and as printed copies as soon as possible after the closing date for entries.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

All performers are urged to read the regulations carefully. Any queries should be emailed to gallowaymusicfestival@gmail.com

 ENTRIES can be made by parents/carers, individuals, teachers, or schools. INCOMPLETE AND LATE ENTRIES MAY NOT BE ACCEPTED!

Performers in the Solo or Duet Classes may enter only one class in any section. Any performer winning a GRADED class must move to a higher class the following year (this includes classes where there was only one performer). Performers in the Beginners class may be any age, and should be at pre-Grade 1 level. If they have previously performed in a Beginners class they may not enter the same class again. They may, however, enter a Beginners class in any other category.

2 SCHOOL ENTRIES

Schools may enter more than one group in the same class, except in choir classes. Due to space limitations in the venue, choir entries should be restricted to 32 performers per school for each Festival class (Classes 53-56). We are very aware of the practical and financial problems of transporting school classes to venues. Classes with a large number of entries may be split between Newton Stewart and Stranraer according to the location of participating schools. Each year we aim to reimburse at least part of the travel costs to schools attending the Festival. Schools wishing to be considered for financial assistance should send copies of paid invoices to the Treasurer (01671 402221) by 30 April 2025. See Regulation 3, Entry Fees.

3 ENTRY FEES should be remitted with Entry Form as follows. ENTRY FEES ARE NON-RETURNABLE.

4 MUSIC - The prescribed edition of music, where specified, must be used by all performers, and where two test pieces are indicated, both must be prepared and performed. No performer may present the same piece in the same class in successive years, or the same piece in more than one class in the same year. Performers who have difficulty in obtaining any test pieces should contact the Entries Secretary without delay. Performers using music should play from original scores. However, photocopies are acceptable for the adjudicators.

In Vocal Classes the songs may be sung in any key to suit the performer's voice, but where the key differs from that in the syllabus, a copy of the transposed version must be provided by 24 January 2025 if an official accompanist is required.

Omit repeats except for da capo.

5 GUIDANCE ON GRADES

The Grades in this syllabus refer to those set by the ABRSM and Trinity College London examination boards. Graded and Advanced classes are for any school age; adults have their own section.

6 ACCOMPANIMENT – Where mentioned in this syllabus, in certain classes a backing track or any form of live accompaniment is acceptable. Performers must ensure that the correct equipment is available. Where this is not mentioned, the use of piano accompaniment is assumed but other forms of live accompaniment may be acceptable if they are suitable for the style of music. An official accompanist will be available but performers are encouraged to bring their own. Performers should arrange rehearsals with the official accompanist themselves if required. Contact Entries Secretary for details. Original copies of music are required for the accompanist by 24 January 2025.

- 7 ADJUDICATION The Adjudicators may stop any performance when their judgement has been formed. Their decision is final. Neither performers nor members of the audience are allowed to communicate with the Adjudicator. The Adjudicator's comment sheets will be presented at the end of each class. Where several grades/school years are grouped together for trophy allocation purposes, each grade/school year will be adjudicated separately with each first place announced, and the performer with the overall highest grade will be awarded the trophy.
- 8 GRADINGS will be awarded to performers as follows:

65-69	Developing	A performance demonstrating an awareness of technical skills, requiring more consistency & artistry
70-74	Progressing	A performance showing development of technique and/or communication and commitment
75-79	Merit	A competent performance, showing some artistic awareness and/or technical ability
80-84	Commended	A convincing performance technically & amp; artistically, with increasing stylistic & communication skills
85-89	Honours	An excellent performance, demonstrating fluent technical and artistic skills with emerging individuality
90-94	Outstanding	An impressive performance technically and artistically, displaying spontaneity & clear individuality
95+	Exceptional	A superlative performance, displaying exceptional artistic individuality

Trophies will be awarded if the winning grade is Commended or above.

9 TROPHIES - All trophies awarded in 2024 (see list on pp. 37-39) should be returned, suitably cleaned and inscribed, by 1 February 2025.

Trophies awarded in 2025 should be returned by 1 February 2026. Certificates for performers will be sent to schools or music teachers after completion of the Festival.

- 10 STATUS The classes are open only to bona-fide amateurs. An amateur is defined as "any person whose whole or partial income is not derived from following the profession in the class for which an entry is submitted." Professional musicians may take part as conductors or in the family class.
- **11** PERFORMERS Please arrive at least 10 minutes before your session starts. Every attempt will be made to adhere to the timetable, but please allow for unavoidable delays.
- **12** CONDUCTORS should not sing with their choirs or groups.

TEACHERS should not play as part of their instrumental groups.

13 UNAVOIDABLE LAST-MINUTE CHANGES

The Festival Committee reserves the right to appoint replacement or additional adjudicators, and to alter, modify or cancel any of the arrangements detailed in the Syllabus.

14 SUPERVISION OF CHILDREN

Primary School children should always be accompanied by an adult. No Primary School children are to leave any venue by themselves. A contact list for all schools taking part will be available at all venues.

15 SAFEGUARDING POLICY

It is important that everyone entering a child reads our safeguarding policy, which can be found on the website. Please download and complete the appropriate form for your entry and return with your official entry form.

In all classes performers must submit 1 copy of their music.

CLASS 1 - PIANO SOLOS

Beginners (See Regulation 1)

Own choice of ONE solo piece from the current ABRSM or Trinity College London piano Initial Grade Syllabus.

Grades 1-6

Own choice of ONE solo piece from the current ABRSM or Trinity College London piano exam syllabus at the relevant grade.

Advanced

Own choice of ONE piece at Grade 7 standard or above, not necessarily from an exam syllabus.

CLASS 2 - PIANO DUETS

NB Performers should change parts for the second piece.

Beginners (See Regulation 1)

Own choice of TWO contrasting pieces from 'Me & My Piano' Duet Book 1 by Waterman & Harewood (Faber) and/or 'Duets for Fun' by J S Bastien (GWM).

Elementary (Approx. Grade 1-2)

Own choice of TWO contrasting pieces from 'Microjazz Duets Collection 1' by Christopher Norton (Boosey & Hawkes) and/or 'Five-Star Classical Duets' by Denis Alexander (Alfred).

Transitional (Approx. Grade 3-4)

Own choice of TWO contrasting pieces from 'Duet Book Level 3' by Denis Alexander (Alfred) and/or 'Mixed Doubles Piano Time Duets' Book 2 by Pauline Hall (Oxford).

Intermediate (Approx. Grade 5-6) Own choice of TWO contrasting pieces from 'Easy Dances Piano Duets' Book 1 by M Seiber (Schott) and/or '20th Century Classics for Piano Duet' Vol. 1 (Boosey & Hawkes). Advanced Own choice of TWO contrasting pieces at Grade 7 standard or above.

Mixed ability (Any age, two different standards) *Own choice of TWO contrasting pieces.*

CLASS 3 - PIANO (SIX HANDS)

Beginners (See Regulation 1)

Own choice of ONE piece from 'Tunes for Three' or 'More Tunes for Three' by Laura Shur (Novello).

Elementary (Approx. Grade 1-3)

Own choice of ONE piece from 'Concert Tunes for Three' by Laura Shur (Novello) or 'Riverdancing' by Pamela Wedgwood (Faber).

Intermediate (Approx. Grade 4-5)

Own choice of ONE piece from '3 pieces for 6 hands at 1 piano' by Mike Cornick (Universal) or 'Microjazz Trios Collection' by Christopher Norton (Boosey & Hawkes).

Advanced Own choice of ONE piece at Grade 6 standard or above.

Mixed Ability (Any age, different standards) *Own choice of ONE piece.*

STRINGS

In all classes performers must submit 1 copy of their music, or 2 copies if an official accompanist is required.

CLASS 4 - VIOLIN SOLOS (WITH ACCOMPANIMENT)

Beginners (See Regulation 1)

Own choice of ONE piece from the current ABRSM or Trinity College London violin Initial Grade Syllabus

Grades 1-6

Own choice of ONE piece from the current ABRSM or Trinity College London violin exam syllabus at the relevant grade.

Advanced

Own choice of ONE piece at Grade 7 standard or above, not necessarily from an exam syllabus.

CLASS 5 - SCOTS FIDDLE (VIOLIN/VIOLA/CELLO) SOLOS (UNACCOMPANIED)

Beginners (See Regulation 1) Primary Secondary *Own choice not exceeding 5 minutes.*

CLASS 6 - VIOLA SOLOS (WITH ACCOMPANIMENT)

Beginners (See Regulation 1)

Own choice of ONE piece from the current ABRSM or Trinity College London viola Initial Grade Syllabus.

Grades 1-6

Own choice of ONE piece from list A, B or C of the current ABRSM or Trinity College London viola exam syllabus at the relevant grade.

Advanced

Own choice of ONE piece at Grade 7 standard or above, not necessarily from an exam syllabus.

CLASS 7 - CELLO SOLOS (WITH ACCOMPANIMENT)

Beginners (See Regulation 1)

Own choice of ONE piece from the current ABRSM or Trinity College London cello Initial Grade Syllabus

Own choice of ONE piece from the current ABRSM or Trinity College London cello exam syllabus at the relevant grade.

Advanced

Own choice of ONE piece at Grade 7 standard or above, not necessarily from an exam syllabus.

CLASS 8 - DOUBLE BASS SOLOS (WITH ACCOMPANIMENT)

Own choice of ONE piece from the current ABRSM or Trinity College London double bass exam syllabus at the relevant grade.

Advanced

Own choice of ONE piece at Grade 7 standard or above, not necessarily from an exam syllabus.

CLASS 9 - CLASSICAL GUITAR SOLOS

Beginners (See Regulation 1) *Own choice of ONE piece.*

Grades 1-6 Own choice of ONE piece from the current ABRSM or Trinity College London guitar exam syllabus at the relevant grade.

Advanced Own choice of ONE piece at Grade 7 standard or above, not necessarily from an exam syllabus.

CLASS 10 - STRING DUETS

(Any two string instruments, two independent parts)

Beginners (See Regulation 1) Primary Secondary *Own choice of ONE piece, with or without accompaniment.*

RECORDERS

In all classes performers must submit 1 copy of their music, or 2 copies if an official accompanist is required.

CLASS 11 - DESCANT RECORDER SOLOS (WITH ACCOMPANIMENT)

Beginners (See Regulation 1)

Own choice of ONE piece from 'Recorder from the Beginning' by John Pitts (Music Sales Ltd, 2004). Any piece from "Skateboard Ride" onwards.

Grades 1-5

Own choice of ONE piece from the current ABRSM or Trinity College London descant recorder exam syllabus at the relevant grade.

Grade 6

Own choice of ONE piece at Grade 6 standard, not necessarily from an exam syllabus.

Advanced

Own choice of ONE piece at Grade 7 standard or above, not necessarily from an exam syllabus.

CLASS 12 - TREBLE RECORDER SOLOS (WITH ACCOMPANIMENT)

Beginners (See Regulation 1)

Own choice of ONE piece from 'Treble Recorder from the Beginning' by John Pitts (Music Sales Ltd, 1995). Any piece from page 6 onwards.

Grades 1-6

Own choice of ONE piece from the current ABRSM or Trinity College London treble recorder exam syllabus at the relevant grade.

Advanced

Own choice of ONE piece at Grade 7 standard or above, not necessarily from an exam syllabus.

CLASS 13 - TENOR RECORDER SOLOS (WITH ACCOMPANIMENT)

Beginners (See Regulation 1)

Own choice of ONE piece (see Descant Recorder solos)

Grades 1-5

Own choice of ONE piece from the current ABRSM or Trinity College London exam syllabus (see Descant Recorder solos) at the relevant grade.

Grade 6 Own choice of ONE piece at Grade 6 standard, not necessarily from an exam syllabus.

Advanced

Own choice of ONE piece at Grade 7 standard or above, not necessarily from an exam syllabus.

CLASS 14 - BASS RECORDER SOLOS (WITH ACCOMPANIMENT)

Beginners (See Regulation 1) Own choice of ONE piece (see Treble Recorder solos).

Grades 1-6

Own choice of ONE piece from the current ABRSM or Trinity College London exam syllabus (see Treble Recorder solos) at the relevant grade.

Advanced

Own choice of ONE piece at Grade 7 standard or above, not necessarily from an exam syllabus.

CLASS 15 - RECORDER DUETS

(Any two recorders, two independent parts)

Beginners (See Regulation 1) Primary Secondary *Own choice of ONE piece, with or without accompaniment.*

CLASS 16 - RECORDER GROUPS - UNISON

(See also Ensembles, p. 26)

Primary Secondary

Own choice of ONE piece, with or without accompaniment.

CLASS 17 - RECORDER GROUPS - 2 OR MORE PARTS

(See also Ensembles, p. 26)

Primary

Secondary

Own choice of ONE piece, with or without accompaniment.

WOODWIND

In all classes performers must submit 1 copy of their music, or 2 copies if an official accompanist is required.

CLASS 18 - FLUTE SOLOS (WITH ACCOMPANIMENT)

Beginners (See Regulation 1)

Own choice of ONE piece from 'Party Time' for Flute (ABRSM or Trinity College London of the Royal Schools of Music).

Grades 1-6

Own choice of ONE piece from the current ABRSM or Trinity College London flute exam syllabus at the relevant grade.

Advanced

Own choice of ONE piece at Grade 7 standard or above, not necessarily from an exam syllabus.

RECITAL CLASS: see page 31

CLASS 19 - OBOE SOLOS (WITH ACCOMPANIMENT)

Beginners (See Regulation 1)

Own choice of ONE piece.

Grade 1-6

Own choice of ONE piece from the current ABRSM or Trinity College London oboe exam syllabus at the relevant grade.

Advanced

Own choice of ONE piece at Grade 7 standard or above, not necessarily from an exam syllabus.

CLASS 20 - CLARINET SOLOS (WITH ACCOMPANIMENT)

Beginners (See Regulation 1)

Own choice of ONE piece from 'Party Time' for Clarinet (ABRSM).

Grades 1-6

Own choice of ONE piece from the current ABRSM or Trinity College London clarinet exam syllabus at the relevant grade.

Advanced

Own choice of ONE piece at Grade 7 standard or above, not necessarily from an exam syllabus.

CLASS 21 - BASSOON SOLOS (WITH ACCOMPANIMENT)

Beginners (See Regulation 1) Own choice of ONE piece.

Grades 1-6

Own choice of ONE piece from the current ABRSM or Trinity College London bassoon exam syllabus at the relevant grade.

Advanced

Own choice of ONE piece at Grade 7 standard or above, not necessarily from an exam syllabus.

Beginners (See Regulation 1) *Own choice of ONE piece.*

Grades 1-6

Own choice of ONE piece at Grade 7 standard or above, not necessarily from an exam syllabus.

(Any two woodwind instruments, two independent parts)

Own choice of ONE piece, with or without accompaniment.

In all classes performers must submit 1 copy of their music, or 2 copies if an official accompanist is required.

CLASS 24 - BRASS SOLOS (WITH ACCOMPANIMENT)

Beginners (See Regulation 1)

Own choice of ONE piece.

Grades 1-6

Own choice of ONE piece from any ABRSM or Trinity College London brass exam syllabus at the relevant grade.

Advanced

Own choice of ONE piece at Grade 7 standard or above, not necessarily from an exam syllabus.

CLASS 25 - BRASS DUETS

(Any two brass instruments, two independent parts)

Beginners (See Regulation 1) Primary Secondary Own choice of ONE piece, with or without accompaniment.

PIPING AND DRUMMING

All performers must submit 1 copy of their music. Performers aged 18 and over see Classes 64-65.

CLASS 26 - CHANTER SOLOS

Performers should not be able to play bagpipes.

Primary Secondary *Own choice of 2 part March any time signature*

CLASS 27 - BAGPIPE SOLOS

Lowland or Highland pipes. Performers may enter more than one class.

Under 14 Own choice of 2 part March any time signature Under 16 Own choice of 4 part March in 2/4 Under 18 - a) Own choice of 4 part March in 2/4 Under 18 - b) Own choice of 4 part Strathspey and Reel

CLASS 28 - DRUMMING SOLOS

Primary Own choice of 2 part March x 2.

Secondary Own choice of 2 part March x 2 or 4 part March x 1.

OTHER INSTRUMENTS

All performers must submit 1 copy of their music, or 2 copies if an official accompanist is required.

CLASS 29 - OTHER INSTRUMENTS SOLOS

(Any other instrument - please specify instrument on entry form)

Beginners (See Regulation 1) Primary Secondary

Own choice of ONE piece, with or without accompaniment, which may include backing track or live accompaniment.

CLASS 30 - OTHER INSTRUMENTS DUETS

(Any other instrument - please specify instrument on entry form)

Beginners (See Regulation 1) Primary Secondary

Own choice of ONE piece, two independent parts, with or without accompaniment, which may include backing track or live accompaniment.

JAZZ

Any instruments. All entries to include some improvisation. Groups to be of 2-6 musicians. Participants may perform with a backing track or live accompaniment.

CLASS 31 - JAZZ SOLOS

Beginners (See Regulation 1) Primary Secondary *Own choice of ONE piece.*

CLASS 32 - JAZZ GROUPS

Primary Secondary *Own choice of ONE piece.*

POP MUSIC

Solos or groups, original songs or covers, with or without backing track. Any instruments, groups to be of 2-6 musicians. All performers must submit 1 copy of their music.

CLASS 33 - POP SOLOS

Beginners (See Regulation 1) Primary Secondary *Own choice of ONE piece.*

CLASS 34 - POP GROUPS

Primary Secondary *Own choice of ONE piece.*

ENSEMBLES

(Instrumental Group, which may include voice) All performers must submit 1 copy of their music. Mixed Primary/Secondary Groups should be entered as Secondary (See Regulation 12)

CLASS 35 - DUOS

(For voice or instrument with piano, to be judged as a partnership) Primary Secondary *Own choice of ONE piece.*

CLASS 36 - SMALL ENSEMBLES, 2–5 PERFORMERS

(Independent parts, with or without accompaniment)

Primary Secondary *Own choice of ONE piece.*

CLASS 37 - ENSEMBLES - UNISON

(Any number of performers)

Primary Secondary Own choice, not exceeding 10 minutes.

CLASSES 38A-38B - ENSEMBLES/ORCHESTRAS -2 OR MORE PARTS

38a - up to 12 performers - Primary

Secondary

38b - 13 or more performers - Primary

Secondary

Own choice, not exceeding 10 minutes.

CLASS 39 - COMMUNITY ENSEMBLES (INSTRUMENTAL OR CHORAL)

Should include both children and adults. Own choice, not exceeding 10 minutes.

CLASS 40 - CEILIDH GROUPS

(Two or more players)

Beginners (See Regulation 1) Primary Secondary Own choice not exceeding 5 minutes.

CLASS 41 - FAMILY CLASS

Vocal and/or instrumental

Any combination of TWO or more performers from the same family. Own choice not exceeding 10 minutes.

See also Piano Duets (Mixed ability), p. 13

VOCAL

In all classes performers must submit 1 copy of their music, or 2 copies if an official accompanist is required.

CLASS 42 - VOCAL SOLOS (WITH ACCOMPANIMENT)

Beginners (See Regulation 1)

Own choice of ONE song from 'Sing Together, 100 songs for unison singing', arr. by William Appleby and Frederick Fowler (OUP).

Grades 1-6

Own choice of ONE song from the current ABRSM or Trinity College London singing exam syllabus at the relevant grade.

Advanced

Own choice of ONE song at Grade 7 standard or above, not necessarily from an exam syllabus.

CLASS 43 - SCOTS SONG SOLO

(With or without accompaniment)

Primary Secondary *Own choice of ONE song.*

CLASS 44 - FOLK SONGS

(Unaccompanied)

Primary Secondary *Own choice of ONE song,*

CLASS 45 - SONGS FROM THE SHOWS

Secondary age *Own choice of ONE song,*

CLASS 46 - AGE 16 TO 18

Opera/Oratorio *Own choice of ONE song.*

CLASS 47 - AGE 16 TO 18

Lieder Own choice of ONE song.

CLASS 48 - VOCAL DUETS

Beginners (See Regulation 1) Primary Secondary Own choice of ONE song, two independent parts.

VOCAL GROUPS (NON-COMPETITIVE)

Performers must submit 1 copy of their music, or 2 copies if an official accompanist is required.

CLASS 49 - SINGING GAME (NURSERY/PRIMARY 1-4)

(Traditional, as it might be played in the playground, i.e. unaccompanied, no dressing up) (See Regulation 2)

Own choice of ONE piece.

CLASS 50 - ACTION SONG (NURSERY/PRIMARY 1-4)

(More of a organised performance, allows for dressing up, props, etc.) (See Regulation 2)

Own choice of ONE piece.

CLASS 51 - CLASS SONG (PRIMARY 4-7)

Voices only.

Own choice of ONE song.

CLASS 52 - GROUP MUSIC MAKING

(Performers of Primary School age and to include instruments) (See Regulation 2)

Own choice of ONE piece.

VOCAL GROUPS (COMPETITIVE) (With live or digital accompaniment)

CLASS 53 - PRIMARY SCHOOL CHOIRS

Submit with entry fee by Friday 24 January 2025.

SPEECH AND VERSE

In all classes performers must submit 1 copy of their verse with entry form. Maximum 3 entries per school per age group.

No performer may present the same piece in successive years.
